



Peach, Spring Snow

These are large sized, clingstone, white peaches. They ripen in late May/early June, making them one of the earliest peaches the season. Taste described as fragrant and floral sweetness. This tree is very vigorous. Self-pollinating. Space to allow a spread of 20 to 25 feet. Begin to bear fruit at 3 or 4 years of age and reach peak productivity at 8 to 12 years. Peaches need clear, hot weather during their growing season and require well-drained soil as well as a regular fertilizing program. They also require heavier pruning than any other fruit trees to maintain size and encourage new growth. Not tolerant of late frosts, so avoid low spots on landscape where cold air will settle. "Winter. Originated on the farm of Joseph Hayward, Sterling, MA. Introduced later by Ephraim Robbins, Leominster, MA, before 1855. Very rare.

Whitish flesh is crisp, tender, juicy and subacid. Recommended for fresh eating. Medium-large angular roundish-oblate fruit is greenish-yellow, white-spotted and orange-blushed. Often presents netted russetting.

Probably dates to well before 1850, maybe even to the time when our first president was considered by some to be

royalty. Another variety rescued from the Tower Hill Collection. Blooms midseason. Z4. Maine Grown. (Standard: 3-6' bare-root trees)."

Peach, Reliance

Prunus persica. Very hardy peach developed in New Hampshire in 1960's. Free-stone peach, that means the fruit does not stick to the pit. Fast growing up to 15'-20' feet tall, or you can prune to keep shorter. Flowers in late spring with pink blooms, which are self-pollinating. Fruit ripens mid to late July with heavy crop of medium sized fruit. Taste is mild and sweet, good fresh and good for canning and freezing. Grows in full sun. Caliper 1/2"-7/8" trunk diameter \$28 for one bareroot tree

"Late Fall-Winter. Probably Worcester County, MA, before 1800. Very old American variety once common in much of Maine, Bangor south.

Firm, crisp, juicy, tender, aromatic: everything you want from a late-fall dessert apple. Large roundish-conic fruit, blushed dark red, striped red, and covered with large conspicuous light-colored spots.

Originally called Nonsuch, later Old Nonsuch, and by the mid 19th c., Red Canada, apparently from Massachusetts growers who took it across the border. Not to be confused with an entirely different Canadian apple called Canada Red! Our scionwood comes from [Tower Hill Botanic Garden](#). Keeps all winter. Blooms late. Z3 or 4. Maine Grown. (Semi-dwarf: 2½-5' bare-root trees)."

Lakemont white table grape

White, seedless table grape. Grown in New York developed by Cornell University. This vine is disease resistant, Hardy to Zone 6. Produces small fruits on dense clusters. Although called white grapes, they are green in color and ripen in late August. Grapes are hard, crunchy and sweet with adherent skin, (not slip-skin). Mild honey and some lambrusca flavor. Great for fresh eating. Plant 6-8 feet apart, in full sun. Self pollinating. Spacing 2-5 feet apart, full sun. \$35 for 3 vines
